Fraternities Matter

Students spend 90% of their time outside the classroom. Fraternities capitalize on those hours by preparing men for success in college and in their futures far beyond what their peers experience. A study of thousands of alumni of diverse backgrounds shows this holds true regardless of an individual's background or socioeconomic status entering college.

Because of higher expectations, as well as the support and network fraternities provide, members experience greater gains in learning and graduate at higher rates than their peers. Nearly 75% of chapters offer focused leadership development programming at least monthly, and 83% of members say their confidence in their leadership skills increased because of their membership. Fraternity and sorority members also report higher levels of interaction with people different from themselves, lending to members being more prepared than their peers to join a diverse workforce and community. So, it is no surprise that fraternity alumni are twice as likely to believe their college experience prepared them well for life after college.

Fraternity members can tap built-in alumni networks, finding jobs more quickly than their peers. Research shows almost half of the members had a brother who helped them find an internship or job and provided them with career advice. Fraternity alumni report being more fulfilled in their careers and lives in every aspect of well-being measured, from career to community and financial to physical, because of the relationships and resources they can leverage.

So, while research shows that one in five students considers joining a fraternity but don't because of concerns around academics or finances, studies show membership is a worthwhile investment.

The Proof:

- 83% of members indicate stronger leadership confidence as a result of their fraternity membership.
- Fraternity members show significantly higher learning gains than their peers in their first year of college.
- Despite being less diverse than students in general, fraternity/sorority members reported higher levels of interaction with people different from themselves than did other students.
- Fraternity alumni are twice as likely to feel that their alma maters prepared them well for life after college and that they gained important job-related skills.
- Fraternity alumni find jobs more quickly after graduation and are more engaged in the workplace.



Fraternities Matter

Fraternity men love their collegiate experience – as students and as alumni. In fact, more than 8 out of 10 fraternity members say they would re-join their organizations. Research shows, that fraternity membership connects men to the university in a way that nonmembers simply don't experience. They're more satisfied as students and as alumni are more likely to recommend and give back to their alma maters. Members are more engaged inside and outside of the classroom than their peers—they report feeling more supported by their faculty and nearly half serve in leadership roles across campus. They're also more connected to their local communities, with research showing they spend significantly more time volunteering than nonaffiliated students.

The Proof:

- 75% of fraternity members demonstrate strong satisfaction with their overall student experience.
- 78% of fraternity members feel a strong connection to campusl and are more satisfied with their experience.
- Nearly half of fraternity members serve in other campus leadership roles.
- Fraternity members are more involved in co-curricular activities, and membership promotes student leadership and development, as well as satisfaction with the collegiate experience.
- Fraternity members have stronger interaction with faculty than their peers, with higher rates of feeling like their professors cared about them as a person or made them excited about learning.
- Fraternity members spend significantly more time volunteering, mentoring, and doing other types of service work, and they feel like they belong in their communities.
- Fraternity members feel a stronger connection to and are more engaged in their communities.
- Fraternity alumni feel a deeper sense of loyalty to their alma mater because of their positive college experiences, and they are more likely to recommend their school to others and donate after graduation.
- If they had to do college over again, more than 8 out of 10 fraternity members would rejoin their organizations.
- Fraternity members report a greater sense of belonging and feeling of being a valued member of their campus community compared to unaffiliated peers.

Alumni Member Spotlight Eric Schmidt

Gamma Chapter, 1992 - University of Illinois

Eric Schmidt is an alumnus of the Gamma Chapter at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. As a former chapter volunteer. we reached out to Brother Schmidt after learning about the continued success of Orange & Brew, his Bottle Shop and Tap Room in Downers Grove, IL. For the second consecutive year. it was recognized as a Reader's Choice Top Beer Bar in the World by Craft Beer & Brewing.

To gain insight into his success and his history with Alpha Kappa Lambda, we spoke with him about his fraternity experience.

Tell us about your experience joining AKL. Did you always know you wanted to be in a fraternity? My experience joining AKL was pretty standard for the time. Several guys from my high school were in the house and reached out to some of us freshmen about checking things out. Before heading to the University of Illinois, I hadn't necessarily thought I wanted to be in a fraternity, but it was certainly something that appealed to me the more I got to know the guys in the house.

It was a way to make a large campus feel smaller, and I specifically liked the fact that we had members from all over the state. While I knew a small pocket of guys already, I also liked that I'd find people from many different backgrounds."



What was your collegiate experience like?

"My college experience wasn't unique by any means, but it was what I made of it. Whenever I speak to students, I tell them that the school experience, especially after high school, is really up to them.

I was lucky enough to find AKL early, and that was a way to personalize college mv experience. From there, I was able to find other "fraternities" of people with similar interestsguys who loved to play pick-up hoops, people who enjoyed certain types of music and concerts, and other students interested in the same courses I was. AKL gave me the first experience of finding a common group of people in a very large place."

What is your favorite AKL memory?

"These days my favorite thing is when a group of us gets together, we tell the same stories over and over every time we see each other while our wives collectively roll their eyes. So there are a lot of fond memories for sure.

Alumni Member Spotlight Eric Schmidt Gamma Chapter, 1992 - University of Illinois

Will share two specific ones - first was when a couple of us saw one of our buddies plaving hoops on our house court outside, and he left his room unlocked. While he was playing, and could have looked into the window at any time and seen this. we systematically moved his entire room to the commons, right down to plugging his digital clock and microwave in. He went up to his room, found it empty, and came back down to the commons to see a handful of us had ordered pizza and were watching his TV in the room we set up exactly how it was upstairs. And the second memory would of course be when the house went to serenade my girlfriend at time. Carrie. as house the sweetheart. Carrie and I are now married."

How do you stay involved with the Fraternity or keep in contact with brothers?

"Social media makes it easy to keep in touch with brothers from U of I. Without a house now, we don't have a lot of opportunities to get together on campus in any organized fashion, but there's definitely still a group of us who connect semi-regularly, vacation, do family things together.



And regardless of how long it's been seeing some of the guys, it's always like we had just hung out "yesterday"."

Were you involved on campus or in the community in other ways besides AKL?

"Most were jobs that I needed to help put myself through school, but I was very fortunate to find things to get paid for that I enjoyed. As а Broadcast Journalism major, I worked for the athletic department in Sports Information (the PR side of college sports). I was a two-year writer, then Sports Editor my last two years of the Illio, our campus yearbook. In addition to that, I was an intramural referee and supervisor, baseball official, and doorman at a campus bar. I hadn't really thought about this before. but all of those experiences wound up having some professional connection for me eventually."

Tell us more about your life and career after college.

"Just like my college years, I've had a lot of professional interests. I started as a TV sports reporter in Champaign. then eventually moved back to Chicago to work for Major League Baseball by running and coaching in their Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities program in Chicago. From there I moved back into TV. first working for the Chicago Tribune's 24-hour news station. then moving into a freelance reporting role for Comcast in Chicago. I was a high school sideline reporter most of the time, but also covered some pro events, was a reporter on "Chicago Bears Community Huddle", and was the food and beverage correspondent for Comcast's entertainment show called "Primetime Chicago".

Ironically with all my sports work, I received my one and only Emmy Award for that show (plus two additional nominations for work). While sports my freelancing, I moved into not-forprofit work...first in healthcare, running the charitable then events for the 2012 Ryder Cup, and then running the charity for Illinois' Department of Natural Resources. About eight years ago I got out of the "real world" and opened a craft beer retail shop with my wife, called "Orange & Brew" in Downers Grove, IL. As you can guess, we're an Illini bar and we're an official alumni game-watch spot. association We're very proud to have been named to Craft Beer & Brewing's "Top Ten Craft Beer Bars in the World" for the past two years."

What advice would you give to our undergraduate members today? What advice would you give to potential new members considering joining a fraternity?

"The advice ľd aive to undergraduate members includes enjoying every minute. Like everyone before me who told me how fast it goes (and I ignored), I tell students the same (and they presumably ignore me!). In addition, someday you'll realize how much the college experience, especially in а fraternity, shapes your professional world.

Being in tight guarters with who have different people backgrounds and opinions helps you learn to get along an compromise with many types of folks. You're not going to like everyone you work with and for, just like in college, so this is a training ground for getting better at being a decent human being. As for potential members considering a fraternity, find a group of guys you have some common interests with and then expand that group to see what the rest of the organization is like. If you can find a house that fits your values at least, it's going to be a great experience. I was lucky that this organization was AKL."

Why AKL? Feel free to answer this question however you interpret it, or answer the following: "Why did you join AKL? Why should others join AKL? Why is AKL special or important?"

"As an undergrad, I probably didn't have a firm grasp on what "binding for life" meant other than I'd "be" an AKL for the rest of my life. What it actually meant was the experiences had we as undergrads as members of AKL helped set us up for life...the lessons in the five ideals wound up being what "bound" us to our values as we got older.

These are skills that aren't learned in a classroom, but rather as a group of men who work together for a common good, in order to make themselves better sons and brothers, and someday maybe fathers themselves. I think AKL gave me a unique experience to get those skills through the mission and values of the organization, and the alumni mentoring. Hopefully most of our alums feel the same way!"

National Events, Programs, and Training

As needs change for our undergraduate chapters, National Headquarters staff is working on updating current trainings and creating new education for all undergraduate members. Supporting the cost of supplies, materials, or other needs for our national events will help our undergraduate members receive the very best quality training without the need to increase cost.

Travel

Travel cost is sometimes the biggest barrier to undergraduate members attending any national event or training. Travel cost cannot be covered by the AKL Educational Foundation but your donation can support travel cost in a couple different ways.

- Airline Miles & Rewards: Are you a frequent flyer? Your airline miles can be donated to support the travel of one or more undergraduate members attending national events.
- Vehicle Rental: Not all members have access to a reliable vehicle to drive to national events. Supporting a chapter by taking care of the cost of a rental vehicle is a great way to ensure safe travel to and from events.

Registration

Registration cost is another barrier to chapters being able to send the maximum number of members to a national event. Health & Safety Decompressing During the Holidays

We know that the news these days might be stressful and anxiety-provoking. While stress isn't always a bad thing, it can sometimes reach an unhealthy level that interferes with our work, school, relationships, and even our ability to enjoy life. If that's the case, it's time to take action. Remember to take care of yourself and those around you, and to be on the lookout for signs of distress including:

- Not sleeping enough or sleeping too much
- Loss of appetite or eating too much
- Experiencing more headaches, muscle aches/tightness, more frequent colds and minor illnesses
- Needing to take deep breaths and feeling slightly light-headed when you think about everything you need to get done or about a situation you can't control
- Frequently irritable, frustrated, angry, impatient and/or anxious
- Difficulty concentrating and therefore not able to get things done as effectively or as easily as usual
- Feeling overwhelming stress and pressure for more than a few days

Self Care:

It's always important to prioritize your emotional health and well-being. Remember to take time for yourself. Make sure to get enough exercise, nutrition, and sleep. Try to keep things in perspective. If you're feeling stressed, try some Press Pause techniques:

- Breathing Exercises
- Perspective Checks
- Movement

Caring for Others:

During this stressful time, be on the lookout for others. In caring for a friend or loved one, here's what you can do:

- Let them know you are concerned: Tell them what you have noticed and why it worries you.
- Listen (really, listen):
 - Try to avoid judgment or jumping to conclusions
 - Be there for them sometimes just knowing that someone cares and is there for them is all someone needs to get through a difficult time
- Don't feel like you have to have all of the answers:
 - Help them out with things that might relieve their anxiety
 - Find a relaxation/meditation app that you like and share it with your friend
 - If it's too much for you to handle, offer to help connect them with professional help

National Membership Entry Fee

This one-time National Membership Entry Fee is assessed when joining the Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda. This must be paid in full along with the National Membership Dues within 30 days of signing. While individual new members are responsible for paying their balance, the chapter is responsible for making sure the National Membership Dues are paid in full. If a member drops or is removed from the roster, the chapter is still responsible for making sure that individual pays, otherwise it is the responsibility of the chapter.

National Membership Dues

The National Membership Dues are billed twice a year and must be collected from every enrolled man on the roster. Billing occurs every August and January. The National Membership Dues must be paid along with the Insurance within 30 days of the start of the semester.

Insurance

Insurance is billed twice a year and must be collected from every enrolled man on the roster. Billing occurs every August and January. The Insurance must be paid along with National Membership Dues within 30 days of the start of the semester.

Educational Programming Fee

Previously called the Meetings Fee, the Educational Programming Fee is billed once a year and must be collected from every enrolled man on the roster. Billing occurs every January. The Educational Programming Fee must be paid along with the National Membership Dues & Insurance within 30 days of the start of the semester.

OmegaFi/Accounting Fee

The OmegaFi/Accounting Fee is billed twice a year and must be collected from every enrolled man on the roster. This fee is collected from every member to pay for the OmegaFi services provided to every Alpha Kappa Lambda chapter.

Chapter/Local Dues

Every chapter must charge Chapter/Local Dues to pay for their events and activities.
