
Your Legacy Is What You Create, Not What You Inherit

Living in Indianapolis and being a Colts fan I have great interest in what is happening with the Colts organization. Most recently the buzz has been about the firing of Jim Caldwell, a coach who has coached three seasons with a winning record overall. This is a man that went to the

Super Bowl his first season as coach. So how did he fail?

One would argue that he was not the one that failed, that he did his head coaching duties. I could agree with that to an extent but I think he set himself up for this failure when he positioned himself to take over the team. I believe that when he was named heir apparent (while his predecessor was still around) he did so by giving away his rights to do it his way, he gave up the opportunity to create his legacy.



Fraternity and Sorority leaders are not necessarily in the same position as a person applying for a head

coach of a football team but they can take a lesson from this. No matter how good something is, when you are in charge you need to own it and to some extent control it. It needs to be your legacy. It needs to be better than what it was before.

You need to view the work that was done and the successes of the past as the foundation for you to build your legacy on. You are not moving into the "house", you are adding on or renovating it. When you leave your position, do you want people to say "He/She kept it together" or do you want them to say "That is when the organization really exploded and he/she took it to the next level".

My challenge to our Fraternity and Sorority leaders, from the of national boards all the way down to the new member class officers: Create your legacy, don't live in someone else's. If you do I think things are going to get even better.

UIFI is a five day institute that brings together fraternity men and sorority women from across North America to create opportunities to explore, define, and enhance their leadership skills, personal awareness, commitment to their fraternity or sorority, and grow to expect values based



action from themselves and those they lead. At UIFI, you will be given the skills to improve your own leadership abilities and positively affect your chapter, council, and community.

Participating in UIFI means that you are willing to talk about how fraternity and sorority leaders live their Ritual. 2012 Conclave Next Summer

The 2012 National Conclave will be held at the <u>Norfolk Waterside</u> <u>Marriott</u> in Norfolk, Virginia on the weekend of August $9^{th} - 12^{th}$. We have exceptional rates at the hotel of \$89.00 a night. Transportation to and from the airport is inexpensive and the closest airport (Norfolk International) is serviced by Southwest Airlines.

Registration rates are \$300 to \$400 per delegate this year (each chapter is required to send two). There are reduced rates for non-delegates and the option for non-delegates to simply purchase meals. You can find more information and register here: <u>2012 Conclave</u>.



Conclave is the biennial business meeting of the Fraternity membership. National officers are elected, legislation is considered and the direction of the Fraternity for the next two years is established. It is important that all chapters and corporation boards send representation. At this event we also hold alumni activities and educational programming. Look for requests for programming ideas to be emailed in the next few weeks.

The biggest mistake a chapter makes is not budgeting for the trip. Your chapter should start setting aside money now for registrations, airfare or gas, hotel costs and any incidentals like food while traveling. The more you save the better off you are and if you don't end up spending it all it means you have extra for the following year's budget.

OmegaFi Update

Many of our members are noticing we are relying more heavily on OmegaFi for specific activities. This is the near future of our Fraternity. Many National organizations, such as Alpha Kappa Lambda, have been searching for a multi-faceted solution for membership management. OmegaFi is one of the very few providers currently and in our opinion the best.

Currently OmegaFi provides the vault financial management system for all of our chapters. The results can't be argued. Our chapters in general have seen a 20% increase in collections of dues and fees based on historical averages for chapters that didn't use professional services. They also provide undergraduate database assistance, and new member reporting/billing functions. The new member reporting has had some "hiccups" but we attribute this to the challenges of change. As always we will continue evaluating and adjusting as needed.

What many do not know is that OmegaFi now handles the AKL Education Foundation annual appeal activities. This is important because it establishes a consistent repetitive appeal program that brings in the funds to support the Foundation's grant and scholarship programs.

This summer we will be adding yet another program offered by OmegaFi that is called Compass. Compass is a national database solution that will allow us to move our database to a state-of-the-art system that expands our opportunities. Membership tracking information will be more detailed, chapter and corporation access to the National database will be a click away, and the current Vault system will seamlessly integrate chapter records into the database. Membership activities reports, chapter activities, officer positions, awards information, career information and so on will all be captured.

It may seem silly to be excited about something like this but we believe once you have viewed the system you will understand how big of an investment and what opportunities lie ahead for AKL. Databases are the most valuable asset for Fraternities. Securing and developing ours is extremely important if we want to be successful for another 100 years.
