

These Hands Don't Hurt

Alpha Kappa Lambda Supports Sexual Assault Awareness Month

Even before its official declaration, Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) was about both awareness and prevention of sexual assault, harassment, and abuse. Looking at the history of the movement to end sexual violence, it's clear why.

It's impossible to prevent an issue no one knows about, and it's difficult to make people aware of a problem without providing a solution. The two work in tandem, and they always have. From the civil rights movement to the founding of the first rape crisis centers to national legislation and beyond, the roots of SAAM run deep.

Alpha Kappa Lambda recognizes that sexual assault is a serious problem on college campuses and believes that it can be fought through education, service, and philanthropic projects.

The first These Hands Don't Hurt event was held in the mid 90's at the Beta Zeta Chapter at East Tennessee State. The event was quickly adopted by the National Fraternity and was officially established as AKL's National Philanthropy in 1996. Since then, chapters have tailored the event to their campuses and communities, finding creative ways to offer support. The hallmark of These Hands Don't Hurt is the "Promise Wall."

While a Promise Wall can take many physical forms, the fundamental idea of the Promise Wall is that advocates take the pledge against domestic violence and sexual assault by pledging their hands will not be used to harm another.

Advocates can take the pledge and physically add their "hand" to the Promise Wall in a number of ways. Paper hands can be traced and cut out prior, where advocates add their signature or words of support before attaching to the wall. If your campus allows washable paint, hands can be painted and stamped onto the Promise Wall. Pro-tip: have latex gloves and wet wipes on hand for easier clean-up.

A Promise Wall should be displayed on campus or in the community. It can



be part of an existing structure such as a wall or window in a public building on campus. Or a free-standing wall constructed by the chapter with materials like ply-board. Other options include banners, posters, or tri-folds that are transported easier.

In addition to a Promise Wall, chapters should focus on awareness, volunteering, and donating funds.

Chapters should include education with their Promise Wall by having literature/resources available. It's not always about raising the funds for a big check but starting the conversation and having correct information to share. Spread the word, encourage others to take the pledge.

Service events can be done by volunteering at a shelter, hotline, or other organization that needs handson assistance. Contact your campus health/wellness center to see if they have any upcoming events they need volunteers for. It may not always be the most glamorous role, but they need assistance in promoting, setting up, and running events.

While service is about donating your time, philanthropy is about raising funds. Donations can be collected in exchange for adding a handprint to the Promise Wall or as an optional contribution to their participation. Or parter with a local business to start a fundraiser. Be transparent with where money collected will be donated. Contact the organization you intend to donate to and invite a speaker or representative to your event.

These Hands Don't Hurt does not end with April. Continue to support survivors and give back all year long.

Gamma Omicron Chapter Dalton State College

Gamma Omicron Chapter at Dalton State College hosted a week of These Hands Don't Hurt events including tabling to raise awareness and sharing resources about how to support survivors, a Promise Wall, and a raffle of gift baskets featuring donations from local businesses.

Overall they raised over \$300 for Green House, a local Child Advocacy and Sexual Assault Center!








Gamma Gamma Chapter Rutgers University





RISK MANAGEMENT

AKL Risk Management Guidelines: Sexual Abuse and Harassment

An organization should not tolerate or condone any form of sexist or sexually abusive behavior on the part of its members, whether physical, mental, or emotional. This is to include any actions, activities, or events, whether on chapter premises or an off-site location which are demeaning to women or men, including but not limited to verbal harassment, sexual assault by individuals or members acting together. The employment or use of strippers, exotic dancers or similar, whether professional or amateur, at a fraternity event as defined in this policy should not be allowed.

What is Sexual Abuse?

To understand sexual abuse, we must define sexual harassment and rape or sexual assault.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT: is defined as the unwelcome, unreciprocated imposition of sexual attention, usually in the context of a relationship of unequal power.

SEXUAL ASSAULT (or conduct or rape): is defined as an act of sexual contact or penetration with a person against his/her will.

There are many types of sexual abuse. Recognize that sexually abusive behavior occurs on a continuum ranging from harassment to rape.

Verbal abuse or sexist behavior may include:

- 1) Whistling, yelling, taunting.
- 2) Humor and jokes about sex or male or female specific traits.
- 3) Suggestive or insulting sounds.
- 4) Sexual innuendoes about your or someone else's personal appearance.
- 5) Sexual innuendoes about your or someone else's sexual activities; and
- 6) Demands for sexual favors accompanied by implied or overt threats

Physical abuse may include:

- 1) Any inappropriate touching, pinching, or patting.
- 2) Brushing against someone else's body.
- 3) Coerced sexual intercourse; and
- 4) Assault



Why Does Sexual Abuse Occur?

Although there is not one direct cause for sexually abusive behavior, there are some factors that help build an environment conducive to sexual abuse. Factors such as gender role stereotyping - what our society says is "feminine" and "masculine" - are part of the problem leading to rape and sexual harassment.

This social environment that encourages males to be aggressive and females to be passive is ripe for sexual abuse. Sexual harassment and rape are issues of power abuse. If we can understand how gender role stereotyping often leads to power imbalances, we can better understand how the phenomenon of sexual abuse happens in our society.

Alpha Kappa Lambda Risk Management Best Practices

- 1) A chapter will not tolerate or condone any form of sexist or sexually abusive behavior on the part of its members, whether physical, mental, or emotional. This is to include any actions that are demeaning to men or women, ranging from assault to harassment or the objectification of individuals.
- 2) A chapter will not sponsor or participate in any activity, including competitive games, community service or philanthropic endeavors, activities associated with recruitment, social events, or events related to activities such as homecoming that are abusive or demeaning.
- 3) A chapter will educate its members on these issues each year.

Summer Break Safety

Summer break, or the months of May through August, is a high risk period of time for chapter houses. It is important you take the time to properly prepare your chapter house for the summer break period. The leading risks to a chapter facility during the summer break period are:

Fire	Vandalism
Wind	Water Damage

Theft Hail

Only two perils on the list are truly unavoidable, that being wind and hail. However, the risks and resulting claims from wind and hail often occur to the roof and structure of the facility, emphasizing the need to have the facility inspected by a professional on a regular basis.

Most incidents involving water damage could have been minimal if someone had taken the time to prepare the house for break. The plumbing issues creating damage often went unchecked for days, weeks and even months. As a result, what would have been a few hundred dollars in clean up and a small plumbing repair turned into a costly claim.

Avoiding a claim can make a significant difference in the cost of property

insurance and ability to provide a safe and healthy environment for undergraduate members.

The benefits of preparing your house for summer break include:

- Avoid the expense and the time associated with a claim and restoring the damaged area.
- With a large loss, you may risk having an uninhabitable house for the fall semester.
- Water damage can lead to mold
- Many insurance policies limit coverage in this area.
- Protect your history from thieves and vandals, A price cannot be put on sentimental value

Use the Summer Break Checklist to help prepare your chapter facility!



Summer Break Checklist

- · Inspect all rooms, document damage and deduct from security deposit
- Complete routine maintenance on furnace/boiler/AC
- Clean and inspect all roof drains and gutters (contact a local professional)
- Repair all broken windows and doors to prevent damage from inclement weather; ensure that doors latch completely
- Have a roofing contractor inspect the roof, provide a written recommendation, and repair any immediate concerns
- Contact emergency service company to conduct an inspection and service emergency lighting, alarm equipment, fires suppression and sprinkler systems
- Clean exterior and interior of chapter house and check security/safety lighting
- Clean/service fireplace and chimney and check for defects or debris
- Inspect the hot water heater and exposed water lines and pipes for slow leaks
- Remove and dispose of debris outside the facility, especially near the dumpster
- Unplug and store unused appliances
- · Service and clean stoves, ovens, hood ranges and other kitchen equipment
- Inform the host institution (college/university) as to whether the residence will be occupied or not and provide proper contact information for the facility

If the chapter facility is unoccupied over the summer:

- Securely lock the property and limit access to only designated caretakers
- Have a responsible alumnus, undergraduate or professional property management company check the property daily to ensure a loss has not occurred. A consistent daily presence will deter thieves and vandals.
- Inform local police and/or campus security the property will not be occupied. Provide them with access to the facility and ask them to patrol frequently
- If it will not affect the function of your fire sprinkler system or other systems, turn the water off at the main supply line (contact a professional for this service)
- · When not in use, remove all hoses and store preferably inside facility
- Hire a mature caretaker to reside in and look after the property in exchange for free/reduced rent if a house mother and/or resident advisor is not available

Nominations will be open until Friday, May 20th, 2022 and announced this summer at the 2022 National Conclave. Winners will be recognized by the National Executive Council and presented with their awards during the in-person event. For the selection process to best work please be sure to fully complete all questions including short answer questions.

Founders' Cup - Nominate Here!

For outstanding performance in all categories, this prestigious award is presented to the Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda's most outstanding chapter in all areas of performance. Consideration of recruitment performance, financial management, campus leadership, risk management, scholarship, and community service are but a few of the areas examined in determining the recipient of AKL's highest award.

Clarence E. Brehm Leadership Award - Nominate Here!

Created in 1982 in honor of Clarence E. Brehm (lota '32). This award is presented to the individual collegiate member who has illustrated superior abilities in leadership. This award is based both on performance within the Fraternity, and participation in campus activities.

Holmes Award – Nominate Here!

Established in 1954, this award is named in honor of Brothers Fred Gooding Holmes (Alpha '15) and Fred Weber Holmes (Alpha '38). Each chapter may nominate one senior or recently graduated member for this honor. The member must have graduated within the last six months. It is presented to the member considered to be the Fraternity's "most outstanding undergraduate member."



Henry T. Moon Outstanding Advisor Award - Nominate Here!

Renamed in 2015 after Henry T. Moon (Tau '57) long time advisor to Tau Chapter at Pennsylvania State University. This award is given to the individual who consistently fulfills and goes beyond all obligations and duties required of a chapter advisor. This award was originally created to recognize volunteers who rise above the call of duty, and guide the chapter effectively toward fulfilling the Fraternity standards and expectations.

Athlete of the Year - Nominate Here!

The recipient is selected from undergraduate members who participate in intercollegiate athletics. The athlete with the most outstanding personal record in his respective sport will be selected.

Outstanding Campus Activity Award - Nominate <u>Here!</u>

This award is presented to the chapter which exemplifies outstanding involvement and activity on campus. Possible examples include campus service projects, musical/theatrical productions, university ambassadors, and other projects which are consistent with the objectives of the Fraternity and the particular host institution where the chapter is located.

Outstanding Community Service Award - Nominate Here!

The award is in recognition of quality, interactive philanthropic programming with the community. This includes both hands-on service and any funds raised. Chapters which illustrate concern for the promotion of human welfare and the surrounding community are eligible for this award.

Mike Uremovich, Kappa Chapter '95

Thompson Presidents' Academy and Officers' Institute while undergraduate officers were returning to education sessions, a man walked up and introduced himself to attendees as well as National Headquarters staff.

That man was Mike Uremovich. a Kappa Chapter and Purdue University alum who by chance was staying at the Carmel Renaissance Hotel the same weekend as Officers' Academy. Mike has recently been named the Butler University Head Football Coach. He previously orchestrated impressive offenses as an FBS coordinator and has held many successful coaching positions.

InsideAKL was delighted to follow-up with Mike after Officers' Academy and share his story with our readers now.


Tell us more about yourself. Where you grew up, hobbies or interests, fun facts, etc.

"I grew up in Manhattan, a small town in Illinois. It is about an hour south of Chicago and had a population of 2,000 when I lived there. I lived in New Lenox, Illinois for my high school years and attended Providence Catholic High School. I really don't have any hobbies outside of coaching, when I get time off, I want to be with my wife and kids."

What collegiate vour experience like?

"I had a great experience in college. I earned a degree in US History with a certification to teach secondary education. It was unique because of my desire to coach football. I spent two years coaching at McCutcheon High School. When the head coach left for a job at Purdue, I had a tough decision to make in order to keep coaching. I would spend the next two years transferring to Purdue Calumet

for the fall term so I could coach high school football at Providence. I would then transfer back to Purdue West Lafayette and move back into the house for the spring terms. It was a lot of paper work but necessary to continue to grow as a coach."

Tell us about your experience joining AKL. Did you always know you wanted to be in a fraternity?

"There is one reason I joined AKL, Chris Woodard. He is still a good friend to this day. I had attended rush events at several houses and I met him at the Co-Rec. He introduced himself and asked me to stop by the house. I had not been to AKL before this visit. I really liked the atmosphere of the house. There were men from all over with different backgrounds and interests. I decided to pledge and fell in love with the place. Four men that I

lived with in the chapter house were in my wedding."

"I believe in brotherhood as friendship of the highest calling. I accept membership in Alpha Kappa Lambda as affiliation that is binding for life." These words have remained true in my life. It doesn't mean everyone always got along or agreed on everything but there was a mutual respect in the house. It was a great experience."

Did you hold any chapter officer roles or leadership responsibilities?

"I was social chair and pledge educator for two semesters. I really enjoyed serving the house in both of these roles. Especially pledge educator, because it allowed me to spend time with the new men joining the house."

"I have several good friends that were younger than me because of this leadership role. I ran for president and lost. Looking back the house made the correct decision!!!"

Could you tell us more about your family and/or personal accolades?

"I have a great family for which my wife Katie (Theta at Purdue) deserves all of the credit. We have three children Ella (17), Mike (15), and Drew (11). They all have made sacrifices in order for me to be a football coach"

"Coaching is a calling that the entire family must be on board with in order to be successful. I am thankful that they see this profession in the same way I do, not in wins and losses, but an opportunity to help change lives. I will never be able to repay them for their commitment to this goal."

How do you stay in contact with the fraternity and brothers?

"I still keep in contact with a lot of

the guys. One of the draw backs to coaching is that I can never attend a homecoming reunion because I always have a game. But many of the guys still take trips to see my teams play every fall."

"I have had guys from the house make trips all over the county to watch us play. It really means a lot, especially now that they all have kids and families. They will never know how much this has meant to me over the years."

What advice would you give to undergraduate members today? What advice would you give to potential new members considering joining a fraternity?

"The only advice I would give would be to join a house. This is the only opportunity you will have in your life to do something like this."

"You will learn more about yourself than you can imagine. The relationships you will form will last the rest of your life. The people you meet will cause you to




