PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Your Fraternity is once again leading the nation in growth and innovative solutions to difficult problems. In 1990 we installed three chapters at major universities: Iowa, Ohio State, and on December 8th . . . Auburn. In 1991 we expect colonies at the University of Washington in Seattle and Northern Illinois University to be chartered along with newer colonies at the University of Missouri, University of Idaho, Emporia State University, and George Mason University.

Keith Gilchrist, our Executive Director, is now chair of the Fraternity Executives' Association Expansion Committee and his ideas on chapter growth are sought by many national fraternities. Robert Bowdish, a recent graduate of the University of Arizona, has been on the expansion trail for the Fraternity the past two years and screens over 100 candidates before choosing 35-40 top flight students to start our colonies. Douglas Lacy joined the staff during the summer of 1990 and is also heavily involved with our colonies in addition to scheduled visits to our established chapters.

Alpha Kappa Lambda has standards and those chapters young and old which fail to meet those standards all of the time quickly find themselves suspended with a significant action plan to complete before being allowed back in good standing. And, yes, we have expelled members who individually have failed to accept responsibility for their actions and their obligations to the Fraternity.

Some of these expulsions may be for Hazing which has historically been outlawed by AKL. In 1990, AKL led the nation in creating a "Bill of Rights" for pledges which appears on page 9.

One of these Spring weekends may I suggest you go to the bookstore and purchase a copy of Brother Allen Drury's new book *Toward What Bright Glory*. This is, in novel form, his loving remembrance of his fraternity days at Stanford in 1938. I think you will enjoy it—I did. It was also an honor for Brother Drury to attend the 75th Anniversary Conclave.

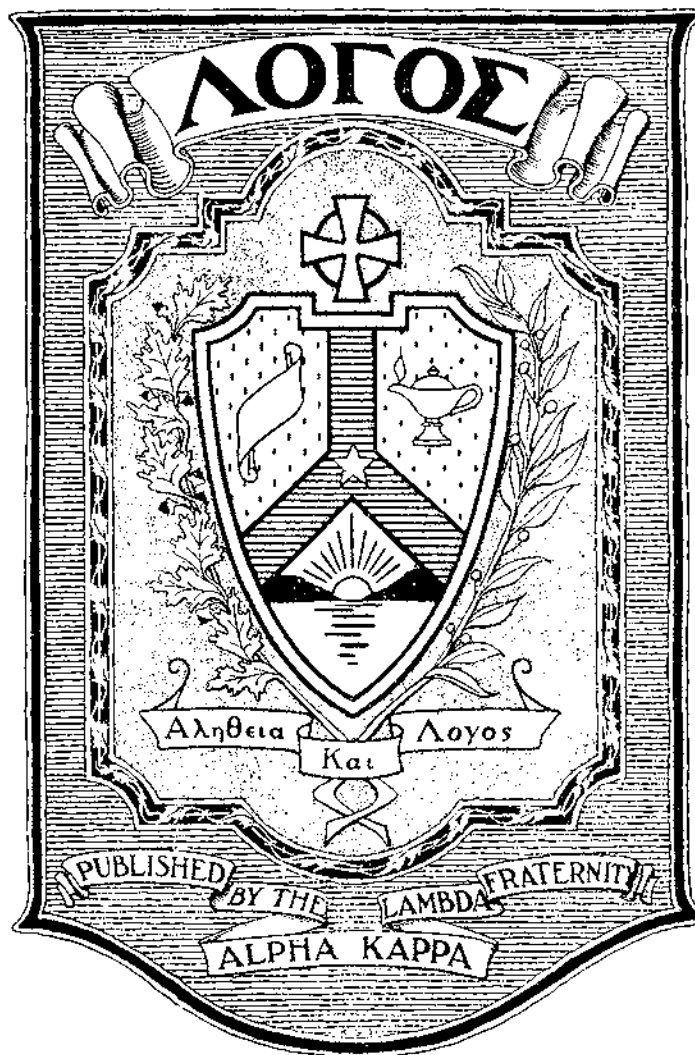

MOST OFTEN ASKED QUESTIONS



WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE FRATERNITY AND THE FOUNDATION?

The AKL Education Foundation and the Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda are separate, distinct legal entities. The Fraternity is a Missouri Corporation, while the Foundation was incorporated in Indiana in 1984. Each has its own board of directors. The National Executive Council, elected at Conclave, runs the Fraternity while the Board of Directors, elected by the voting members, direct the Foundation. (Voting members of the AKL Education Foundation are those alumni who contribute \$100 or more during the fiscal year.) R. Keith Gilchrist (Kappa '53) as Executive Director of the Fraternity and Secretary of the Foundation manages the day-to-day operations of both. The Foundation pays a management fee to the Fraternity for these services.

Both organizations are non-profit. The Fraternity is qualified by the IRS as a Section 501(c)(7)—social organization; the Foundation, Section 501(c)(3)—educational and charitable. Contributions to the Foundation are deductible under IRS provisions if the donor itemizes.

Contributions to the Fraternity or made directly to any chapter are not tax deductible.

The Foundation was formed to solicit money that, in turn, pays for the educational programming provided to undergraduates by the Fraternity.



HOW CAN I INVEST IN THE FUTURE OF ALPHA KAPPA LAMBDA?

CASH

Gifts made in cash are the most common and convenient way to support the Foundation. The contributor is entitled to an income tax deduction for the entire amount of their gift for the year in which it is paid. Money goes into the Foundation's general fund to pay administrative costs and to fund AKL's educational programs, except when it is designated to an established chapter account. A donor can also name specific programs to benefit from his gift.

SECURITIES

A gift of securities is an ideal way to support the Foundation and not pay tax on capital gains. The market value of the securities on the date of

the gift is available as a tax deduction, and you don't have to recognize the capital gain for tax purposes. If your gift exceeds certain limitations for that year, your contribution can be carried forward and deducted in the five succeeding years, until your gift is completely deducted.

LIFE INSURANCE

If your life insurance needs have diminished; your policy has outlived its purpose; or you want to make a significant gift without parting with a significant amount of cash, think of a charitable gift of life insurance. You can do that in two ways:

First, you can assign an existing policy to the Foundation. You can take a tax deduction for the cost basis of the policy or its fair market value. If the policy isn't fully paid up, you can deduct future premiums as you pay them.

Second, you can designate the Foundation as the beneficiary of a policy. However, premiums are not deductible for tax purposes. Your personal agent can give you the details.

REAL ESTATE

It is possible to donate a primary residence, vacation home, farm or most any property to the Foundation. You can even reserve the right to continue to use the property as long as you or your spouse lives. There are

several tax advantages when donating real estate.

GIFTS-IN-KIND

This allows the giver to present something of value to the Foundation without depleting cash or savings. More practical gifts, such as computers, etc., would be especially welcome. The tax deductible value of such gifts is determined by an appraisal obtained by the donor.

BEQUESTS

A simple and thoughtful way to ensure the future of Alpha Kappa Lambda. A specific dollar amount, piece of property, etc., may be left to the Foundation, or a donor may wish to assign a certain percentage of his estate or even leave a residual of his estate to the Foundation. Your attorney, accountant or the Foundation office can provide you with further details on charitable giving.



WHAT DOES THE FOUNDATION DO WITH THE MONEY?

The Foundation is working towards the goal of funding 100% of AKL's educational programming ex-

penses. The Fraternity and Foundation are always looking for ways to improve the quality of each member's fraternity experience. Here is what we are doing right now:

PRESIDENTS' ACADEMY

In January, 1991, the first ever Presidents' Academy was held at National Headquarters in Indianapolis. The Academy is a 3 day educational workshop exclusively for Chapter Presidents. All travel and lodging expenses of the Presidents are covered by the Foundation. This will become an annual event, with all Chapter Presidents required to attend.

At this year's Academy, the Presidents received intensive training in Marketing and Motivation from the nationally known Jeff Magee. Currently Vice President/Director of National Sales and Marketing and chief operating officer for Target Marketing, Mr. Magee brought a strong message to the leaders of our chapters. Magee is being held on retainer by the Foundation for individual chapters to host his program on their campus.

CHAPTER CHALLENGE GRANTS

As an on-going support program for our chapters, the Foundation has made money available for chapters to sponsor educational programs at the local level. These funds are designated as Chapter Challenge Grants.

Any chapter can apply for the Grants simply by submitting their plan to the Foundation. Programs in

the past have ranged from Drug Awareness to Motivational Speakers. The amount of money awarded depends upon the number of members participating and the expenses involved.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The longest running use of Foundation funds has been the awarding of scholarships, our Alethia Awards. These awards are available to undergraduate members of the Fraternity and are based on achievement and need. The scholarships are awarded at the National Conclave.

Another important part of the scholarship program are those awarded to members who help in the area of expansion. Most recently scholarships were given to students at the University of Iowa and Auburn University who were active participants in the colonization efforts on these particular campuses. Scholarship money is also made available to NHQ staff members through summer internships and our traveling consultants.





CHAPTER NEWS

PLEDGE BILL OF RIGHTS

WHEREAS The Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda opposes all forms of hazing and is committed to a program of Fraternity Education that is an educationally and socially maturing process;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following be considered the 'Bill of Rights' for a pledge member in the Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda.

Each pledge member, as a fundamental right which is an inherent part of his association with the Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda, may refuse to participate in any activity which he feels will:

- Endanger his physical and/or mental health
- Reduce his self-esteem
- Violate any local, state or federal law
- Involve the use of alcohol
- Violate his moral or religious convictions

Any discrimination, or threatened discrimination, toward a pledge member by reason of his exercise of this 'Bill of Rights' should be reported to the Chapter President and/or Executive Director of the Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda at (317) 924-4265.

CHAPTER ACCOUNTS

Alumni can make tax-deductible contributions to the Foundation and earmark them for their specific chapter

providing the chapter has an established account. Chapter Accounts may be used for two purposes.

SCHOLARSHIP—Interest earned from the fund can be used by the chapter to award scholarships to individual members or for a number of other educational purposes.

BUILDING—Recent IRS "private letter rulings" have made it possible to borrow money or receive grants from Chapter Accounts for the purpose of buying, building or renovating chapter housing.

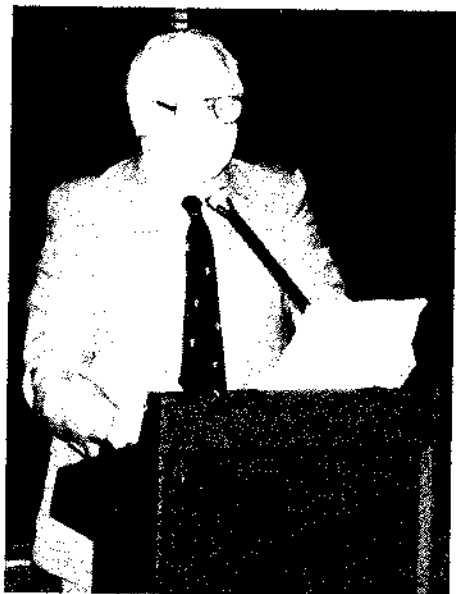

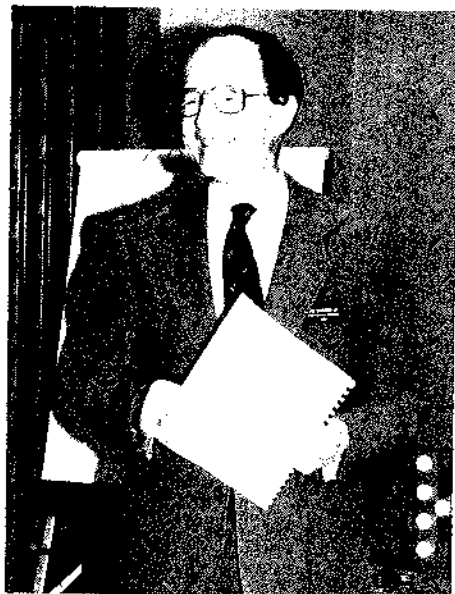
Allen Agnew

Allen F. Agnew, Gamma '37—Brother Agnew received the Alumni Distinguished Service Award at the 75th Anniversary Conclave in Berkeley. Allen was recognized for his numerous professional experiences and accomplishments as well as his devotion to AKL.

Allen has spent over 40 years in positions varying from university professor to Senior Specialist in Environmental Policy for the U.S. Library of Congress. He completed his undergraduate work at the University of Illinois in 1940 where he was initiated into Gamma Chapter. In 1949, he obtained his Ph.D. degree in Geology from Stanford University. His long list of honors begins with Phi Beta Kappa at Illinois and includes his listing in *Who's Who in America* since 1955. He is the author of over 150 professional articles and books and is a member of numerous professional societies.

James G. Emerson, Beta '46—Brother Emerson was recognized at the Diamond Anniversary Conclave in August 1989 for his distinguished contributions to his community and AKL.

Dr. Emerson completed his undergraduate work in 1946 at Stanford University where he was a member of Beta Chapter. He graduated from the Princeton Theological Seminary in 1949 and earned a Ph.D degree from the University of Chicago in 1959. Since being ordained by the Philadelphia Presbytery in June, 1949, Jim has served as pastor of churches in New York City; Bloomfield, New Jersey; Larchmont, New York; and Denver, Colorado. In 1979, he assumed pastoral duties at the Calvary Presbyterian Church in San Francisco from which he retired in the fall of 1990.

Plans call for he and Migs to go to Bangalore, India this summer to teach for a semester. After spending a month or so in mainland China they will return to California in time to attend the Big Game . . . and be home for Thanksgiving.

Brother Emerson accepted the position of AKL National Chaplain in March, 1969 and has been a significant volunteer ever since. He served as National President from 1979-81, and has been a contributor to *The Logos* for over 20 years. Dr. Emerson has also overseen revisions of our Fraternity Manual, *The Truth and the Word*.

Loyal H. Davis, Eta Chapter, is an exceptional individual. Brother Davis was selected as the recipient of
